
The Family Tree is one of two primary components of genealogy



Combined Together --- A greater chance of success to solve your family tree mysteries.

What is a Family Tree?

An essential part of working family history (also known as genealogy)



Standard convention is to put the male (father) to the left for each couple but this is certainly not required

Ways to Create a Family Tree

	Local (family tree software)	Online (Ancestry, MyHeritage, WikiLinks)	FamilySearch (one world tree)
Safe storage (can't be deleted or altered by another company)	X

Personal Software

- Usually purchased for a personal computer
- A good practice to keep a full family tree on the computer as insurance in case the online trees are removed, company goes down, etc.
- These are probably the two most common but there are more (I personally use RootsMagic)



Good Practices

- Enter date/location of birth/marriage/death as much as possible using known and reliable sources
 - Birth certificates or birth indices, Social Security Index *not* other people's trees
- Use biological birth names and individuals (not adopted parents, etc.)





Caution

- Be careful with automated "hints" which may be incorrect
- This is what Ancestry tries to hint at being my grandmother's father (she was born in 1908, he died in 1900!)
- Ancestry clearly is not checking dates on hints to prevent impossible relationships



Family Tree (vertical) vs. Pedigree (horizontal)




Note: this view often shows persons beyond direct ancestors

What is a GEDCOM?

- A common format to save and/or share a family tree
- Plain text format

GEDCOM, an acronym for GEnealogical Data Communication, is a standardized file format for exchanging family tree information

between different genealogy software and websites. It acts as a universal language for family history data, allowing users to export their research from one program and import it into another, and is widely supported across the industry. This ensures family history isn't locked into a single program and can be backed up and shared.

Inside a GEDCOM

- Full name
- BMD (birth, marriage, death) records
- Standardized format

- Can be exported and imported by:
 - WikiTree
 - Ancestry
 - MyHeritage
 - RootsMagic
 - FamilyTreeMaker

For persons taking DNA tests --- some suggestions

- Be sure to always have a good tree,
 5+ generations if possible
- On Ancestry, keep it public and attached to your DNA kit (you can always have other trees private)
- Backup your tree (store on local software)
- Export your tree in GEDCOM format
- Upload your tree (GEDCOM file) to GedMatch and WikiTree




Don't copy other person's tree unless you've thoroughly verified it

- This is a common problem on Ancestry and possibly other services in an effort to "grow" one's tree easily and quickly
 - There will often be errors in other people's trees and you're just multiplying to the problem by blindly copying



Good Practice

• Keep names in your trees to just their names---avoid other qualifiers such as "great grandpa", "royal blood", etc.





 Contributions made by one person can be edited by others (for better or worse)

This is an example of someone whom I do not know and am not related to who merged two individuals into one---in this case the husband of a grand-aunt of mine.



- Other people unknowingly making significant changes to people in my tree!
- My experience has been poor in this regard as others made changes that were not correct
 - Examples: changing the father (currently) unknown) of my grandmother to match her given birth name (!!!)
 - Changing my mother's surname because her birth certificate indicated her surname to her mother's name because her parents were not married at the time (!!!)

One Last Thing on FamilySearch Trees


- The site uses this one world tree to imply relationships to famous people
 - While fascinating and fun, proper vigilance needs to be taken as there are many errors in that tree
 - When I try to verify a relationship I'm often left with an impossible ancestor in the connecting path

Always carefully verify these relationships to ensure the ancestral line is correct and is possible.

- Completely free with a good carefully sourced reputation
- Strongly recommend uploading a copy of your tree here

How does WikiTree work?

- 1 Collaboration on modern family history is <u>private</u> and tightly-controlled through <u>Trusted Lists</u>. Non-genealogist family members you <u>invite</u> probably won't move beyond this level.
- 2 Collaboration on deeper ancestry is between genealogists who are committed to accuracy and cite <u>sources</u>. We trust each other to abide by a special <u>Honor Code</u>.



My WikiTree: Navigation Home




- This is the entry for my maternal grandmother; most of the information and sources were entered by myself
